BOARD APPROVED A RESOLUTION CONCERNING A STREET RECONSTRUCTION PROJECT ON MANG AVENUE IN THE AMOUNT OF \$4,490,000.00.

Trustee Jones moved to approve a Resolution authorizing a borrowing for a Street Reconstruction Project on Mang Avenue in the amount of \$4,490,000.00.

BOARD APPROVED A RESOLUTION FOR A CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECT FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS BUILDING IN THE AMOUNT OF \$324,000.
