Maria Galla of 33 Delaware Road/51 Westgate Road is reaching out because of the continued difficulty caused by the closure of Delaware Road for the Farmers Market. She says that her business at 33 Delaware Road is open on Sundays and that the closure is making it difficult for patrons to find parking and get to the spa. She asked if the barricade can be moved up so that her patrons can still have access to the property, or if there were any other possible solutions.
