The meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by Mayor Mang. The Mayor led the Pledge of Allegiance.

BOARD APPROVED NUSSBAUMER & CLARKE, INC. TO PERFORM ENGINEERING FOR AN ENGINEERING PLANNING GRANT AND TO SIGN AN AGREEMENT.

Trustee Jones moved to approve Nussbaumer & Clarke, Inc. to perform engineering for an engineering planning grant and to sign an agreement. A copy of this agreement is appended to these minutes for record purposes.

Seconded by Trustee Genesky and adopted by a full vote in the affirmative.

BOARD APPROVED A RESOLUTION AND ISSUED A NEGATIVE DECLARATION CONCERNING THE PLANNED UNIT DEVELOPMENT PROJECT (PUD) AT 2765 DELAWARE AVENUE.

BOARD APPROVED A REQUEST TO DESIGNATE A PIECE OF EQUIPMENT AT THE FIRE DEPARTMENT AS SURPLUS.

Seconded by Trustee Ring and adopted by a full vote in the affirmative.

BOARD APPROVED A RESOLUTION FOR A BUDGET AMENDMENT TO ADDRESS A POLICE DEPARTMENT DONATION.

Trustee Jones moved to approve a Resolution for a budget amendment to address a Police Department donation in the amount of \$2,500.

Seconded by Trustee Genesky and adopted by a full vote in the affirmative.

BOARD GAVE PERMISSION TO THE RESIDENTS OF WARDMAN ROAD TO HOLD A BLOCK PARTY.

Trustee Genesky moved to approve and grant permission to the residents of Wardman Road, between Delaware Road and Myron Avenue, to hold a block party on Saturday, September 12th, 2026, with a rain date of September 19th, 2026, at the request of Mark Rountree.

Seconded by Trustee Jones and adopted by a full vote of all members present.

ABSTRACT OF AUDITED VOUCHERS.

Trustee Genesky offered the following resolution and moved for its adoption:

RESOLVED, that the Mayor be and he hereby is authorized to sign the Abstract of Audited Vouchers dated August 4, 2026, in the amount of \$404,758.57; General Fund \$388,481.05; Water Fund \$10,727.52; Sewer Fund \$5,550.00; to direct the Treasurer to pay each of the listed claimants in the amount appearing opposite his/her name.

Seconded by Trustee Jones and adopted by a full vote in the affirmative.

INVITATION FOR PUBLIC COMMENT/QUESTIONS

The Mayor asked if anyone wished to be heard.

Tim Higgins of 200 West Hazeltine Avenue expressed concern over cameras installed on West Hazeltine Avenue. He feels that these cameras are intrusive and an invasion of privacy. He says that he's also noticed cameras in other locations in the Village. Mr. Higgins feels that the money could have been spent elsewhere

Police Chief Phillips stated that the cameras were purchased with a NYS Tech Grant and that these cameras are only used for criminal investigations. The Chief said that he's aware of privacy concerns, but that the footage from these cameras is only used for investigations and in accord with criminal justice and departmental policy. There is limited access and the information is only stored for 30 days. He said that the information collected on these cameras is a valuable help after a crime is committed and has assisted in solving crimes. The Chief stated that, for him, the priority is public safety, and reiterated that these cameras are only used to aid criminal investigations. Chief Phillips stated that the KPD is required to maintain audit trails and adhere to strict policy to ensure that the use is limited to public safety.

Mr. Higgins was glad to hear that footage is only kept for 30 days and carefully monitored.

Mayor Mang said he trusts the Kenmore Police Departments in its use of this footage and that it helps to keep Kenmore safe. He thanked Mr. Higgins for coming to the meeting and stated that he appreciates his concern.

There were no other questions or comments.

The meeting was adjourned.
